Happy Fall Brothers,

As we enter the final quarter of the year, there are a few things happening that will require your attention. One of those things is, of course, dues. Our by-laws change was sent to Grand Lodge for approval and as soon as they have been approved by the Grand Master, our 2025 Dues Notices and cards will be printed and sent to me to be mailed to you. If you have moved recently, please email me with your new address so that I can make sure your member profile has the accurate address. Along with dues notices for next year, it's also time for final notices and summons for brothers that have not yet paid their 2024 Dues. I'm happy to say that we have gone from 60 brothers in May to only 19 brothers currently that have not yet paid or contacted the lodge to explain why they haven't paid. The names of

these 19 brothers was read at the last Stated Meeting of September and the members present were asked to contact any of the brothers they were able to hopefully prevent them from being suspended. Any brother that has not paid his 2024 Dues or been placed on the Emeritus list by action of the lodge before December 27th will be suspended.

The end of the year also means it's election time! No, I'm not talking about that election, I'm talking about your elected lodge officers for the 2025 year. Per the Digest, nominations must be received by the Secretary prior to the opening of the first Stated Communication in November. The nominee must make a statement in writing stating he will accept the position if elected. This also must be received by the Secretary prior to the opening of the first Stated Communication in November. Both forms are available in the Monthly Mail section of the Grand Lodge website. I can also provide copies at the lodge or by email. The nomination for any elected position must be done by a member of this lodge and both the nominee and nominator must provide their GL member number on the nomination forms.

Finally, I would like to let everyone know that going forward, the building use calendar will be viewable on the lodge website at <https://winterparklodge.org/calendar/>. The calendar will show lodge events, as well as those of the appendant bodies and other groups that rent our building. Any requests to use the building need to be approved by the building committee in advance before any planned event. The appendant bodies have specific nights reserved each month, even during months when they may be dark and not having their regular meeting. Any use of the lodge on those nights needs to be discussed with the appendant body and the building committee.

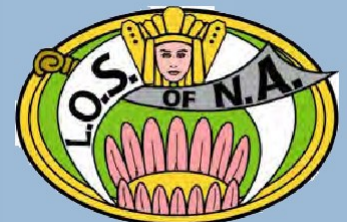

William Shakespeare 1564-1616: Was He a Freemason?

William Shakespeare, English playwright and poet, was born in Stratford-on-Avon, Warwickshire, England in April 1564. Few would deny that William Shakespeare is recognized as the greatest writer known to the English language. He died on April 23, 1616, and was buried in the chancel of Trinity Church, Stratford-on-Avon.

The first collected edition of Shakespeare, The First Folio, was published in 1623. The first edition of Shakespeare to divide the plays into Acts and Scenes and to mark the exits and entrances is that of Nicholas Rowe in 1709. Other important early editions include those of Alexander Pope (1725), Lewis Theobald (1733), and Samuel Johnson (1765).

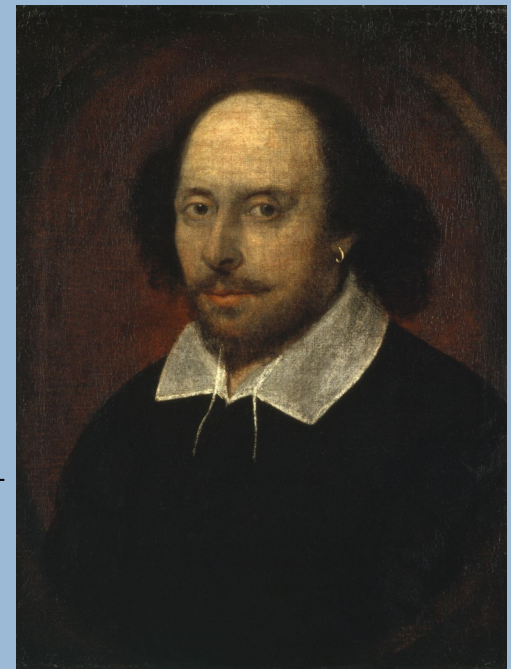
Few records of Shakespeare's private life survive, and there has been considerable speculation about such matters as his physical appearance, religious beliefs, and whether others wrote the works attributed to him. With the passing of time, the person, character, and attributed writings of Shakespeare become more controversial, including the question, "Was Shakespeare a Freemason?"

At present there is in existence in London, England, Shakespeare Lodge No. 99 and in New York City Shakespeare Lodge No. 750 but this does not in any way prove his membership in the Craft. However, the supporters of the contention concerning his Masonic membership point out many unusual statements and thoughts in the writings attributed to him.

There has never been discovered any documentary evidence that William Shakespeare was a member of a Lodge. There is also no documentary evidence existing that Shakespeare actually penned anything attributed to him. Actors at that time had no written scripts and mouth to ear was the means of instruction for the stage.

Shakespeare became an actor and playwright for the Lord Chamberlain's Men, the company later became the King's Men under James I. Acting was a well-regarded profession and he enjoyed a comfortable living throughout his career. Before the closing of the theaters by the Puritans in 1642 English audiences had become overwhelmingly aristocratic and included those most likely to have the means and the intellectual interest to become involved in Freemasonry.

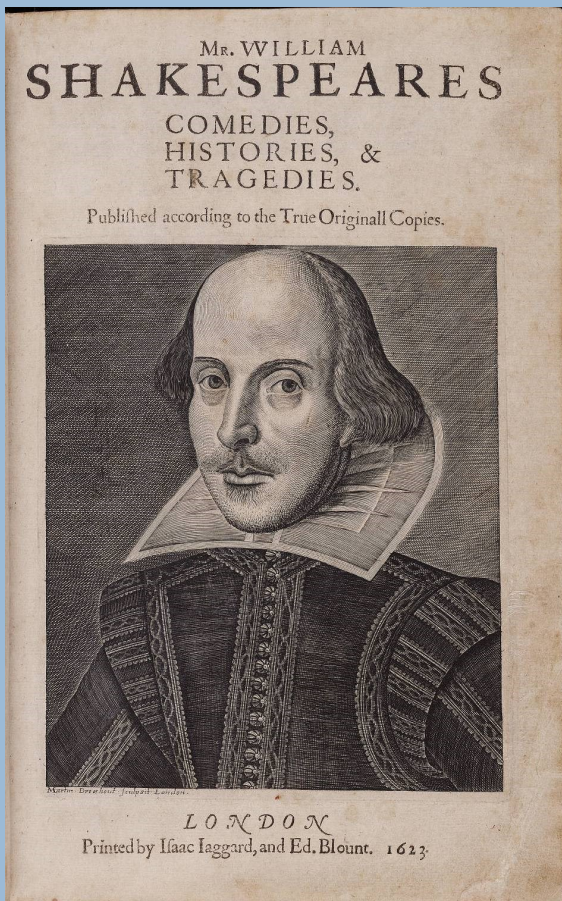
During his adult days, the Operative Craft was in a period of transition to the Speculative Craft. Undoubtedly there were "time immemorial" Lodges in existence at that time in the area where he lived and worked. Just as so many of the individuals involved in the American stage and motion picture industry were members of the Fraternity it is not unreasonable to suggest that the actors in Shakespeare's day were well aware of the theatrical element of Freemasonry and participated in its activities.

It is of interest to note that the development of printed Masonic rituals and the development of the printed works of Shakespeare parallels the development of printing. Just as the works of Shakespeare were revised, edited, interpreted, and otherwise "improved upon," so also was the Masonic ritual or code of ceremonies to be followed as a settled procedure to be followed in the Lodge.

The history of the art of printing is closely intertwined with the evolution of any printed work. The story of the invention of printing and of its early days on the continent of Europe and in England is a long and fascinating tale.

William Caxton first introduced the art in England in 1476. Richard Pynson, who worked for Caxton and eventually became a prominent book publisher on his own, spoke of Caxton as "my Worshipful Master." Perhaps Pynson was simply honoring his predecessor by calling him "worshipful master," or perhaps Pynson belonged to the same Masonic Lodge, where, as is well known, the term "Worshipful Master" applies to the Mason elected to preside in the Masonic Lodge.

When William Tyndale introduced the first printed Bibles to England in 1526, they were denounced by the bishops and suppressed. Tyndale was seized in Antwerp, condemned for heresy, and strangled at the stake before his body was burned in 1536. This work by Tyndale was the basis for the King James Version of the Bible.

The first printed documents to bear the name ritual and purport to be exposés of the Masonic ritual that have come to light were the unauthorized exposés of Freemasonry that appeared during the early years of the premier Grand Lodge of England, beginning with the first publication in 1723, the same year the first Constitutions of that body were issued.

A considerable number of persons thoroughly did these works, since one of these exposes came out on the average every year for the next 30 years and thereafter at a somewhat slower pace, continuing to and beyond the end of that century

Here are a few selections from the published works of Shakespeare that should be of interest to Freemasons, especially those Brothers who are familiar with both the works of Shakespeare and the Masonic ritual.

"Now, whence came you"
(Merry Wives of Windsor, Act IV Scene V)

"Come swear to that: Kiss the book"
(The Tempest, Act 11, Scene 11)

"Let's part the word, No! I'll not be your half"
(Love's Labor Lost, Act V, Scene 11)

"Both are at the Lodge"
(Titus Andronicus. Act 11, Scene IV)

"And whisper one another in the ear; and he that speaks doth grip the hearer's wrist"
(King John, Act IV, Scene 11)

"But this is a Worshipful Society"
(King John, Act I, Scene I)

"I am a brother of gracious order, late come from the sea"
(Measure for Measure, Act 111, Scene 11)

"That, my old Worshipful Master"
(Taming of the Shrew, Act V, Scene I)

"The singing masons building roofs of gold"
(King Henry V, Act I, Scene IV)

"Who would fardels bear, to grunt and sweat under a weary life, but that the dread of something after death - the undiscovered country, from whose bourn no traveler returns ..."
(Hamlet Act 111, Scene I)
