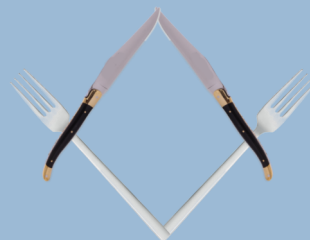

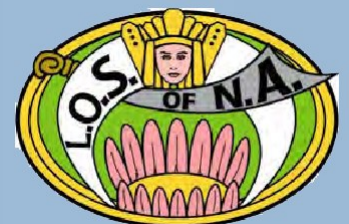

A Lodge in a Tavern

Tun Tavern was a tavern and brewery in Philadelphia that was a meeting place or foundation for several notable groups. It is best known as the birthplace of the United States Marine Corps, but it has a Masonic significance in addition to the military.

Originally built as a brewery, Tun Tavern became a meeting place for early American leaders. The Masonic Center's long and eventful association with Benjamin Franklin, one of the most influential founding fathers of the American nation, endows it with glory and historical connotation. Tun Tavern has the distinction of being the first recruitment point for the United States Marine Corps.

On November 10, 1775, Masonic leader Robert Mullan was authorized by Congress to raise the first regiment of the Continental Marines, the forerunner of the US Marine Corps. Capt. Samuel Nicholas, another Freemason, led the recruitment drive from the lodge and established two battalions that played a crucial role in crippling British supplies and boosting the military power of the revolutionary army during the War of Independence.

The site was owned by a Freemason, Brother John Hobart, of St. John's Lodge No. 1 which formed from a meeting at Tun Tavern.

In 1685, Joshua Carpenter set up Tun Tavern, overlooking Philadelphia's historic waterfront. The brew house's location close to the Tun Alley-Water Street intersection made it a convenient meeting place for people of all hues. This "First Brew House" of Philadelphia shot to prominence with its recognition as the seat of Masonic teachings in America.

In 1720, the St. George's Society, a charitable initiative to help English settlers arriving in America, selected the tavern for its first-ever meeting. Tun Tavern hosted the inaugural conference of American Freemason order and election of the first "Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania" in 1732.

Tun Tavern derives its most significant historical mileage from its association with Benjamin Franklin, the most prominent American of his time and pioneer of the United Continental struggle for independence. Tun Tavern came to be identified with the vivacious personality of this great leader and his works as an author, politician, diplomat, Masonic scholar, and civil activist.

Franklin, who was initiated into the fold of Tun Tavern in 1731, became the third Grand Master in 1734 due to his popularity and leadership qualities. His engaging political publications found a way from this lodge to spread throughout the colonies. It is the very place where Benjamin Franklin initiated the work for unity among various schools of masons and political groups to drive out King George III's red coats and inspired them with the idea of a united and great nation.

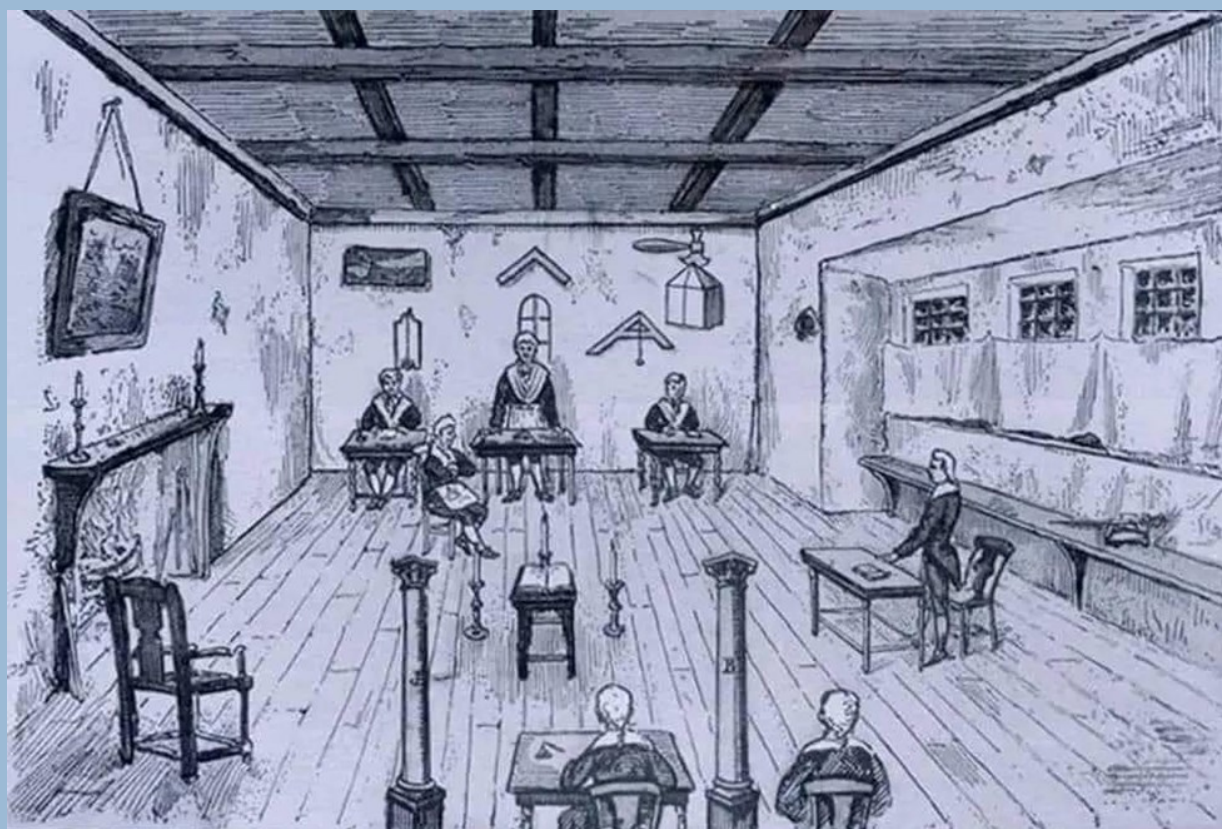
Thanks to Franklin's efforts, the Masonic Center played an important role during the American War of Independence. He hosted Thomas Jefferson and George Washington at the lodge several times which shaped the struggle for freedom and the course of a new nation. Prominent leaders and statesmen met at the tavern during the first and second Continental Congress held in Philadelphia. Tun Tavern was witness to the historic efforts by Franklin to bring all colonies under a single entity, steer public opinion on independence, and seek an egalitarian order free from dominance and racial feeling.

In 1756, Tun Tavern Freemason Lodge occupied a central position in Franklin's efforts to create the Pennsylvania Militia. The bar/restaurant became the recruiting point for the regiment that fought against the native tribes and secured the life and property of settlers.

On November 10, 1775, Masonic leader Robert Mullan was authorized by the Congress to raise the first regiment of the Continental Marines, the forerunner of the US Marine Corps. Capt. Samuel Nicholas, another Freemason, led the recruitment drive from the lodge and established two battalions that played a crucial role in crippling British supplies and boosting the military power of the revolutionary army during the War of Independence.

In 1781, near the end of the American Revolution, Tun Tavern burned down. Its former structure stood at a location now occupied by Interstate 95, where it passes Penn's Landing. Tun Alley once existed between Walnut and Chestnut Streets east of Front Street. A commemorative marker on the east side of Front Street indicates the site, across from Sansom Walk.

In homage to the likely 1775 Tun Tavern menu, the U.S. Marine Corps National Museum located in Quantico, Virginia, contains a Tun Tavern-themed restaurant, whose lunch menu includes beer and other beverages, peanut soup and bread pudding, the non-alcoholic recipe of which remains a traditional staple among some U.S. Marine food services to this day.

FIRST TIME USERS

Click on Request a New Account and enter your information in the designated fields and click submit. Your email will be used as your username/account when signing into the Member Portal. Make sure the information you are typing in the fields matches your Masonic Record or the request will be denied and you will have to request a new account again.

Member Portal password requirements: Password length must be 8+ characters, use at least 1 upper, 1 lower, 1 digit and 1 special character (!@#\$%^*)

**Please note that the new account requests have to be approved and are checked multiple times a day.*
