

# The Vital Skills We're Losing To Technology [SUGGESTION: Make this a group discussion topic. Lots to consider and share.]

In this discussion, we delve into the trend of essential human skills eroded by our increasing reliance on technology. While technology offers numerous benefits, it is crucial to recognize and actively counter its potential to diminish fundamental human capabilities that contribute to our sense of satisfaction, self-efficacy, and overall well-being.

Use underlining, highlighting, and margin notes to further develop your reading skills.

We should examine the skill of writing in the context of emerging AI technologies like ChatGPT. While AI can generate text with remarkable speed and proficiency, human writing possesses unique qualities rooted in lived experience and empathy. Writing is not just as a means of communication, but as a tool for organizing and clarifying our thoughts. The act of crafting written words forces a level of cognitive synthesis that is absent in purely oral communication or AI-generated content. Consistent writing practice can hone our ability to articulate complex ideas coherently and thoughtfully.

- **Craftsmanship:** Engaging in hands-on activities connects us to the physical world, fosters creativity, and improves well-being. Incorporate crafts into your life.
- **Solitude:** Constant connectivity makes genuine solitude rare. Intentionally disconnect to allow for reflection and inner connection.
- Balance is key: The podcast advocates for a mindful integration of technology without sacrificing essential human skills.
- **Reclaiming skills enhances well-being:** Actively cultivating these skills can lead to greater satisfaction, self-efficacy, and a stronger connection to the world.
- Humanity beyond technology: The goal is to remain "human beings" and not just passive users of technology.
- Mindful engagement: Be conscious of your use of technology and its impact on your inherent abilities.
