

In April, the US Postal Service announced that the price of a First-Class Forever stamp would be increasing from \$0.73 to \$0.78. You may be asking why I'm telling you this. I'm mentioning this because we are rapidly approaching \$1 per piece of mail. This is important because we currently have over 70 Brothers who have not yet paid their 2025 Dues that were due last December. Any Brothers that have not paid by the end of June will be receiving a Notice of Delinquent Dues via First-Class mail as required by the Digest.



So you can help us save money on postage by paying your dues before June 30th! Dues can be paid online via the lodge website.

As previously mentioned, the annual Grand Communication will once again be held Memorial Day weekend this year. The pre-registration forms have already been sent to Grand Lodge, so it is too late to pre-register, but if you are planning to attend, you can still beat the craziness Monday morning by checking in Sunday afternoon. You will need your 2025 Dues Card, so if you have paid and have not yet received your card, please let me know as soon as possible.

Congratulations to our Brothers who have recently been initiated and passed. Last year, our lodge had the fewest degrees that we've had in a long time. This year, we are on track to initiate at least a half dozen candidates. We also have a couple of Brothers who were initiated at other lodges that are transferring to Winter Park Lodge and will be finishing their journey as members of our lodge. We also may be conferring degrees as a courtesy for a Brother who is a member of the Grand Lodge of California. We do have petitions that should be ready for investigation and balloting, so don't be surprised when the W:.M:. asks for volunteers at the upcoming meeting. It is our responsibility to the lodge and these candidates to give them a timely investigation so that their petition can proceed to ballot. Since the lodge has voted to go Dark for our second Stated Meeting in May (May 27th), any petitions that can be received at our first meeting this month will have all of May for the investigation so that we can ballot on them in June. This also means the Sr Deacon and Wardens will be looking for Degree teams for these candidates and Brothers. Let's make sure these degrees are the best possible degrees. Last but not least, don't forget the annual St John's Day Breakfast on June 28th. Make sure you add this to your calendar!

What's Wrong With My Lodge?

Freemasonry is built on tradition, but when does honoring the past hinder growth?

If meetings feel repetitive, attendance declines, and younger Masons seem disengaged, it may be time to ask whether the lodge is evolving or simply going through the motions. One sign of stagnation is leadership that never changes. When the same Brothers rotate through the officer chairs year after year, new leaders may be unable to step forward.

Meetings that feel routine and uninspiring can also be an issue. If gatherings consist only of reading minutes and paying bills, with little focus on education or fellowship, they risk becoming an obligation rather than something meaningful.

Resistance to new ideas is another red flag. If suggestions for improvement are dismissed, "That's not how we do things," It signals an unwillingness to adapt.

A lodge that isolates itself from the community or rarely organizes events beyond its stated meetings may also struggle to stay relevant.

Most importantly, if younger Masons do not return after being raised, it likely means they are not finding what they sought: mentorship, wisdom, and true fraternity.

Revitalizing a lodge does not mean abandoning tradition, but it requires a willingness to grow. Encouraging new leadership, incorporating Masonic education into meetings, and creating opportunities for all members to participate can help restore energy and purpose.

A lodge that engages with the community and listens to its members will always remain strong. A lodge that clings to the past without embracing the future risks fading into obscurity.

Freemasonry has endured for centuries because men of vision dared to refine and renew it while preserving its core values. The strength of any lodge lies not just in its traditions, but in its ability to inspire, educate, and engage each generation.

The future is ours to shape, but will we rise to the challenge? I'll leave you to it.

New Member Portal - Master Mason Exams!

Great news! Since Circumscribe is no longer an active system, we have implemented a new Member Portal to take Master Mason Exams I, II, III and view your personal member profile! LINK TO MEMBER PORTAL: Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons

(members.glflamason.org) (click CTRL on your keyboard as you click the link above and it will direct you to the member portal)

FIRST TIME USERS

Click on Request a New Account and enter your information in the designated fields and click submit.

Your email will be used as your username/account when signing into the Member Portal. Make sure the information you are typing in the fields matches your Masonic Record or the request will be denied and you will have to request a new account again.

Member Portal password requirements: Password length must be 8+ characters, use at least 1 upper, 1 lower, 1 digit and 1 special character (!@#\$%^*)

*Please note that the new account requests have to be approved and are checked multiple times a day. If you have any issues, comments, questions, concerns please direct them to Maegan


