Greetings Brethren,

I hope everyone is staying safe and healthy. Welcome to the September Trestle Board.

I don't have too much to discuss in this month's article, but I did want to give you my opinions on the Grand Masters Directives No. 5 and 6, that came out this past month concerning COVID.

The Grand Master's directive No. 5 states that,  
**"Lodges that do not feel it is safe to hold Stated or Called Communication may suspend meetings without Dispensation from the Grand Master."**

It is my opinion, that currently, I do not intend to suspend or go dark for any meetings throughout the rest of this year. I believe we have now crossed the threshold of personal choice. The vaccine is out there and any adult who wishes to get it may do so, and if you choose not too then that is also a personal choice. I truly believe in personal choice and freedom and if we take the proper precautions, it is my belief that we can continue our Lodge business, our meetings and our masonic outings safely.

That being said, the Grand Masters directive No. 6 also states that,

**"If you have been exposed to COVID-19 or even if there is a possibility, however small, that you have been exposed you must self-quarantine until you can get tested for the virus. If you test positive you are not under any circumstances to attend a Masonic function. Not following these guidelines puts your Brothers and their families at risk and will be considered un-Masonic conduct and charges may be preferred by my orders."**

I stand behind this sentiment and I am asking that you not put any of your Brothers at risk. If you feel that you may have been exposed or are feeling sick in any way please do not come to Lodge or any of the other events. Please, do not put your Lodge in a position to have to put forth any charges on a Brother. We must make good personal choices, as the choices we make can effect others.

One thing to put on the calendar is that Winter Park Lodge will have a Master Mason degree at the first Stated meeting in September. So, if you are able to come out and attend this meeting, we could really use you in the degree to support the three Brothers who will be raised.

Also, at the first stated meeting of every month I present the Mason of the Month award for to a Brother for their outstanding service to our Lodge. For August, I presented this award to Bro. J.W.: Russ Anderson. Bro. Russ Anderson works hard prepping meals in the kitchen and also he sat in the East at our last Fellow Craft Degree and did a wonderful job. I think it's important to recognize him and thank him publicly, so thank you again Bro. Anderson for your service to our Lodge.

In closing, I truly hope I get to see you at one of our stated meetings or at a masonic outing very soon. As always, I hope this year brings you all health and happiness. God Bless my Brothers, and God bless the United States of America.

Brother the verb: a Brother(verb) is also an adult human male who has met the requirements to receive the three degrees of Freemasonry. Similar to the noun Brother the verb Brother can also be identified by their Masonic decals and other outward displays of affiliation. Unlike the noun Brother the verb Brother can usually be found at the Lodge putting in work in the kitchen, sitting in chairs for Degree work or raising their hands looking for ways to help the Worshipful Master and other officers run the Lodge.

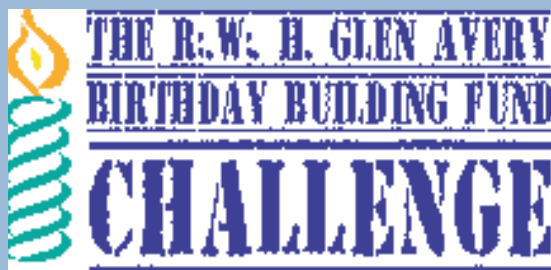

### Scottish Rite Valley of Orlando



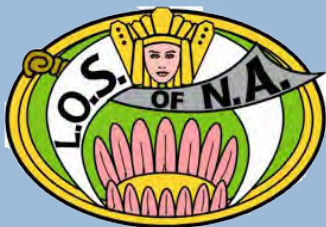
